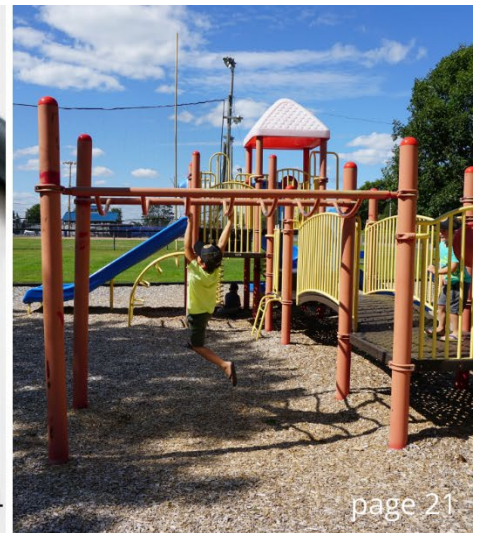

You can register to our alert and communication system — Telmatik — on our website for free. In case of emergency, you will receive a message from the municipality in the format of your choice: via text message, email, or phone call. Financial Services



TAX SERVICES

The due dates for the final residential and farm tax bills are June 30 and September 30. Your bill will arrive in early June.

Commercial, industrial, and multi-residential taxes will be mailed in early August and will be due on August 31 and September 30. If the municipality is unable to collect the taxes due to certain legislative requirements, the due dates will be deferred.

You have three options for paying your taxes:

1. In person or by mail by sending your cheque payable to the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet to the following address : 205, Old Highway 17, C.P. 350 Plantagenet ON K0B 1L0 ;
2. In person or online through your banking institution ;
3. By depositing your cheque in the secure box outside the Town Hall.

NOTE: Do not forget that you can leave us post-dated cheques.

You will receive your interim tax bill annually in early March. The sum of this bill will be equal to 50% of the sum of taxes billed in the previous year.

PRE-AUTHORIZED PAYMENTS FOR TAXES AND ET WATER BILLS

You can join this plan for the current year by registering now with the tax department. This plan is also available for water and sewer bills. The registration deadline is on December 15 of each year. The plan can be cancelled by the taxpayer in writing, twenty (20) days before the next payment, or by the municipality if a payment is returned by a financial institution. ELECTRONIC BILLING OF PROPERTY TAX AND PUBLIC SERVICES

Please note that the Alfred and Plantagenet Township will soon be offering a paperless billing service. Subscribe now to receive your property and utility bills by emailing your name and email address to our Finance Department at finance@alfred-plantagenet.com.

REASSESSMENT AND PHASE-IN

All property values have been updated by MPAC to reflect market value beginning with the 2020 tax year. To mitigate the impact, this assessment increase will be spread over the next four years at twenty-five per cent (25%) per year. Note that if MPAC has made an additional assessment, a change in classification, or a reduction in assessment, that assessment will not be subject to phase-in.

PROPERTY ASSESSMENT

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is the organization responsible for the assessment of your property. If you do not agree with the assessment notice, please contact MPAC at **1-866-296-6722**.

MPAC's **AboutMyProperty** is a secure, online service that allows property owners to access their property's assessment file information and the assessment values of similar properties of their choice, free of charge. For more information, please visit www.mpac.ca.



REMINDER CONCERNING ONLINE TAX PAYMENT

Please remember that there are 15 digit "positions" to enter when making an online tax payment through your banking institution. We found that the number of digits under beneficiary (Township of Alfred and Plantagenet – taxes) was incorrect; please make sure that the number under the municipality tax heading contains **15 digits** and corresponds to your roll number on your tax bill, as shown below.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR WENDOVER RESIDENTS

Residents of the Village of Wendover whose properties are predominantly located along Main Street and private roads are serviced by the Sewage Tank Effluent Pump System, known as the « STEP System », please note that eaves, troughs, and basement sump pumps should not be connected to the « STEP System » since this additional volume of water creates backflow problems in the sanitary sewer network. Storm water does not need processing at the sewage treatment plant if it is not mixed with the sewer network. We are asking for your cooperation in order to eliminate these connections to the « STEP System ».

If the volumes of water requiring treatment at the plant are reduced, it will cost less to operate the plant and taxpayers would benefit directly from the savings.

WATER METERS



1. The large sweep hand (red) indicates the consumption.
2. Low-flow indicator (white triangle) will turn at the slightest demand for water.
3. 6 digit register (including 2 decimals, in black) indicates how many cubic meters were consumed since installation

Most homes and businesses are equipped with a water meter similar to the one pictured above.

Several factors may influence the water consumption of a household, such as:

- The number of people living in the household and their water consumption habits;
- Watering outdoor plants and lawns ;
- Pool or spa maintenance;
- Obsolete toilets and appliances; and
- Leaky toilets, faucets, and plumbing.

REPORT ON WATER QUALITY

The Ontario Clean Water Agency (OCWA) prepares annual reports on drinking water quality after treatment in the municipal plants. These reports are provided free of charge upon request at the municipal office in Plantagenet or by sending written requests by mail to the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet.

REGISTRY OFFICE

REGULAR MEETINGS AND COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

Regular Council and Committee of the Whole meetings are held in the Plantagenet Town Hall conference room or online.

The regular meetings are held on the first Tuesday of every month.

The Committee of the Whole is held on every third Tuesday of every month, except on holidays where the meetings are postponed to the following day.

SPECIAL MEETINGS

Special meetings are called based on need to address urgent or specific matters. The president of the Council may call a special meeting, or the Registrar may also call a special meeting after receiving a petition signed by the majority of the Council members. This petition must also specify the date of the requested meeting.

CLOSED MEETINGS

All Council meetings are open to the public. However, the Council may be required to a meeting or a portion thereof in private.

Before holding a meeting or any part thereof in private, the Council shall state by resolution the fact that the meeting is to be held in private and the general nature of the matter to be considered during the closed meeting.

COMMISSIONER OF OATHS SERVICES

Commissioner of Oaths services offer affidavits, sworn or statutory declarations and life certificates.

We strongly advise you to contact the Township prior to your visit to ensure that a Commissioner of Oaths is available to sign your document.

Fees apply for these services.



INTEGRITY COMMISSIONER

The Integrity Commissioner is an independent and impartial position reporting directly to the Council. They carry out the following core functions:

Advisory Role: The Integrity Commissioner provides confidential written and oral advice to the Mayor, Councillors, and Local Board appointees about their own situations respecting the Code of Conduct for Members of the Council. The Integrity Commissioner also provides opinions and reports to the Council on issues of ethics and integrity.

Investigative Role: Complaints about breaches of the Code of Conduct are made to the Integrity Commissioner in accordance to the complaint protocol approved by the Council. Should the Integrity Commissioner find a member to be in violation of the Code, they can recommend the imposition of various sanctions by the Council.

Educational Role: The Integrity Commissioner is responsible for providing educational programs to members of the Council and Local Boards.

MARRIAGE LICENCE

The Township of Alfred and Plantagenet does not issue marriage licences.

OPEN-AIR FIRES



When is a permit required? : If the size of an open-air fire exceeds one (1) cubic meter (3 ft. x 3 ft. x 3 ft.), you are obligated to obtain a fire permit.

Forms and cost: Fire permit forms are available online or at the Town Hall. They cost 50\$ for a 90-day period.

Criteria for an open-air fire of less than one cubic meter: You can only burn dry wood; your fire must be located at a minimum distance of 5 meters or 16 feet away from any part of a main building, rear or side lot line, tree, hedge, fence, overhead power line, and any combustible material.

Fees and fines: Persons setting an open-air or brushfire in a field without a permit (or if the fire burns out of control) will be charged a service fee if firefighters are required to attend, or are subject to a fine under the Provincial Offences Act.

WINTER PARKING

Please note that overnight winter parking is prohibited on the Township's public roads from 12 a.m. to 7 a.m. from November 1st to April 1st of the following year.

SNOW REMOVAL

According to By-law 2010-42, no person shall deposit or push snow or ice onto or across a public road at any time. Please keep snow on your property.

GARAGE SALES

According to By-law 2015-73, garage sales are permitted:

- Friday evenings (after 5 p.m.), Saturdays, and Sundays of the first full weekend in May, June, July, August, September, and October;
- In May: Friday evenings (after 5 p.m.), Saturdays, Sundays, and Mondays of the Victoria Day vacation weekend;
- In August: Friday evenings (after 5 p.m.), Saturdays, Sundays, and Mondays of the Civic Holiday vacation weekend;

- In September: Friday evenings (after 5 p.m.), Saturdays, Sundays, and Mondays of the Labour Day vacation weekend.

YARD MAINTENANCE

The municipality has the authority to require property owners or occupants to clean up their properties. Every owner or occupier of land shall keep the property free of garbage, debris, household or industrial waste, and abandoned vehicles, and shall ensure that the property is free of infestation.

Each property owner or occupant shall maintain their lawns/natural grass to a maximum height of 18 cm, and rid their property of weeds.

BY-LAW ON THE DEPOSIT OF WASTE ON PUBLIC ROADS

(By-law 2010-42) No person shall deposit, drop, scatter, dump, push, pile or throw any domestic or industrial waste, snow or ice, mud or soil on a highway (street/roadway) or sidewalk, or permit any tree, bush or woody growth to be placed or spread on a highway or sidewalk in such a manner as to obstruct, impede access to or endanger persons using the highway or sidewalk.

BY-LAW ON ANIMAL CONTROL AND DOG LICENSING

Dogs wearing tags in accordance with the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet regulations allows for quick and effective identification in the event of a lost or escaped animal. By-law 2007-84 section 3.a) requires that all dogs owned by persons residing in the Township be registered and tagged. If you have registered your dog with the Township and it goes astray, Animal Control will make every effort to trace it and reunite you with your pet.

Form: You can fill out the dog tag application form, available online, and return it to the Township physically or by email. All address changes or mention of a death must be communicated to the By-law department.

Fees from January 1st to April 30th

For each dog (male or female): \$20

Kennel licence (more than three dogs): \$100

The same fee applies for a new adoption or a new resident. Add a 5\$ fee if you want to receive your dog tags by mail.

Fees from May 1st to December 31st

For each dog (male or female): \$40

Kennel licence (more than three dogs): \$110

Add a 5\$ fee if you want to receive your dog tags by mail.

Ownership of an unregistered dog can result in a \$105 fine. If you have to appear in court under the current law, the maximum penalty can be as high as \$5,000.

SUMMER WATERING

By-law 2009-39 as amended by By-law 2011-58 provides that no person shall use water from the municipal water supply between June 1 and September 30 of each year for the purpose of watering lawns, gardens, flowers, etc. outside of an establishment with the following exception:

- Residents of odd-numbered buildings are allowed to water the lawn and garden between 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on odd-numbered days (1, 3, 5, etc.);
- Residents of even-numbered buildings are allowed to water the lawn and garden between 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on even-numbered days (2, 4, 6, etc.).

TEMPORARY “TEMPO” CARPORT

By-law 42-2014 states that a temporary carport ("tempo shelter") cannot be installed before October 15 of the current year and must be removed by April 30 of the following year.

The storage of the temporary shelter must include the entire structure. The structure shall not be more than 4 metres in height and shall be located in the front yard, 1.5 metres from any side yard line and/or public road. It shall not be located in a sight triangle.

A permit is required for a permanent installation of one such carport, and they are only permitted in the backyard.

BEAVER PROBLEMS?

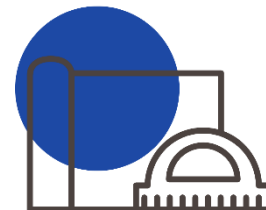
The municipality is responsible for removing obstructions such as beaver dams on municipal drains. (The owners of the municipal drain then share the costs). However, the municipality is not responsible for the maintenance of natural watercourses or private drains. It is the responsibility of the property owner to contact a specialized trapper to remove the beaver. The municipality or the Ministry of Natural Resources can provide you with the names of trappers in the area

PLANNING SERVICES

All development applications within the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet must be processed through the Planning Department. **Phone number:** 613-673-4797 ext. 3

- Land parcels and subdivision plan;
- Zoning By-law Amendment and Local Official Plan Amendment;
- Minor Variance;
- Part lot control;
- Site plan for the development of three or more residential units, commercial and industrial development;
- Solar panels.

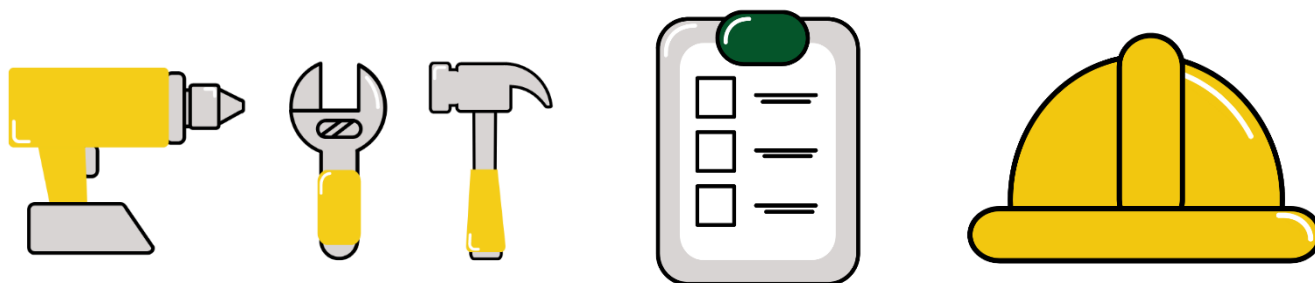
CONSTRUCTION

Anyone wishing to renovate, demolish or construct a building on their property must first obtain a building or demolition permit. A building permit is a licence that legally allows a construction project to begin.

A permit is required for any pool or spa installation at a cost of \$252.

WASTE AND RECYCLING

WASTE COLLECTION

Garbage and recycling will be collected on a regular schedule throughout the year, except on Christmas Day and New Year's Day. The collection scheduled for each of these holidays will be postponed by one day (e.g.: Monday's collection will be postponed to Tuesday, Tuesday's to Wednesday, etc.).

REGULAR GARBAGE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION SCHEDULE

Tuesday:	Village of Alfred County Road 15 to Concession 4, Alfred Concession 4, Alfred, from County Road 15 to Montée Lajeunesse
Wednesday:	Village of Curran County Road 2 and County Road 19 Concessions 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9 et 10 (nord), Plantagenet
Thursday:	County Road 17, from the corner of Montée Lajeunesse to County Road 15 Village of Lefaivre Concession 1, Alfred and Domaine Road County Road 15 between Lefaivre and Concession 4, Alfred Concession 4, Alfred, from County Road 15 to Blue Corner Road, and Concession 5, Alfred County Road 17 between County Road 15 and Blue Corner Road County Road 15, south of County Road 17, including Station Road to the south extremity of the municipality. Concession 7, Alfred Concessions 10 and 11, Alfred Blue Corner Road (northwest of the road) Ritchance Road (The section that is part of the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet)

COMMERCIAL GARBAGE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION SCHEDULE

Tuesday:	Collection of recycling from businesses throughout the Canton.
Wednesday:	Collection of waste (metal containers and/or 360-litre bins) from Alfred and Lefavre businesses.
Thursday:	Collection of waste (metal containers and/or 360-litre bins) from Curran, Plantagenet and Wendover businesses.

Waste Container

A 120 litre (32 gallons) waste container marked with the Township logo is provided to each residence. This container is the waste limit for each home registered in the Township each week. You may not use any other containers for the weekly collection. Please place your garbage and recycling no more than 5 metres (15 feet) from the roadway in front of your property before 7:00 a.m. on the morning of your pick-up.



This container is the responsibility of the landowner at all times and must remain with the property, even if the property is sold or a tenant has moved.

Surplus Garbage Tags

If you have more trash, you will need to purchase and mark your extra bags with an official yellow tag. Each tag costs \$2. A minimum of 10 tags, or \$20, are required per transaction. They are available at City Hall, libraries and the Township landfill.

The Following Items Will Not Be Picked Up At Any Time

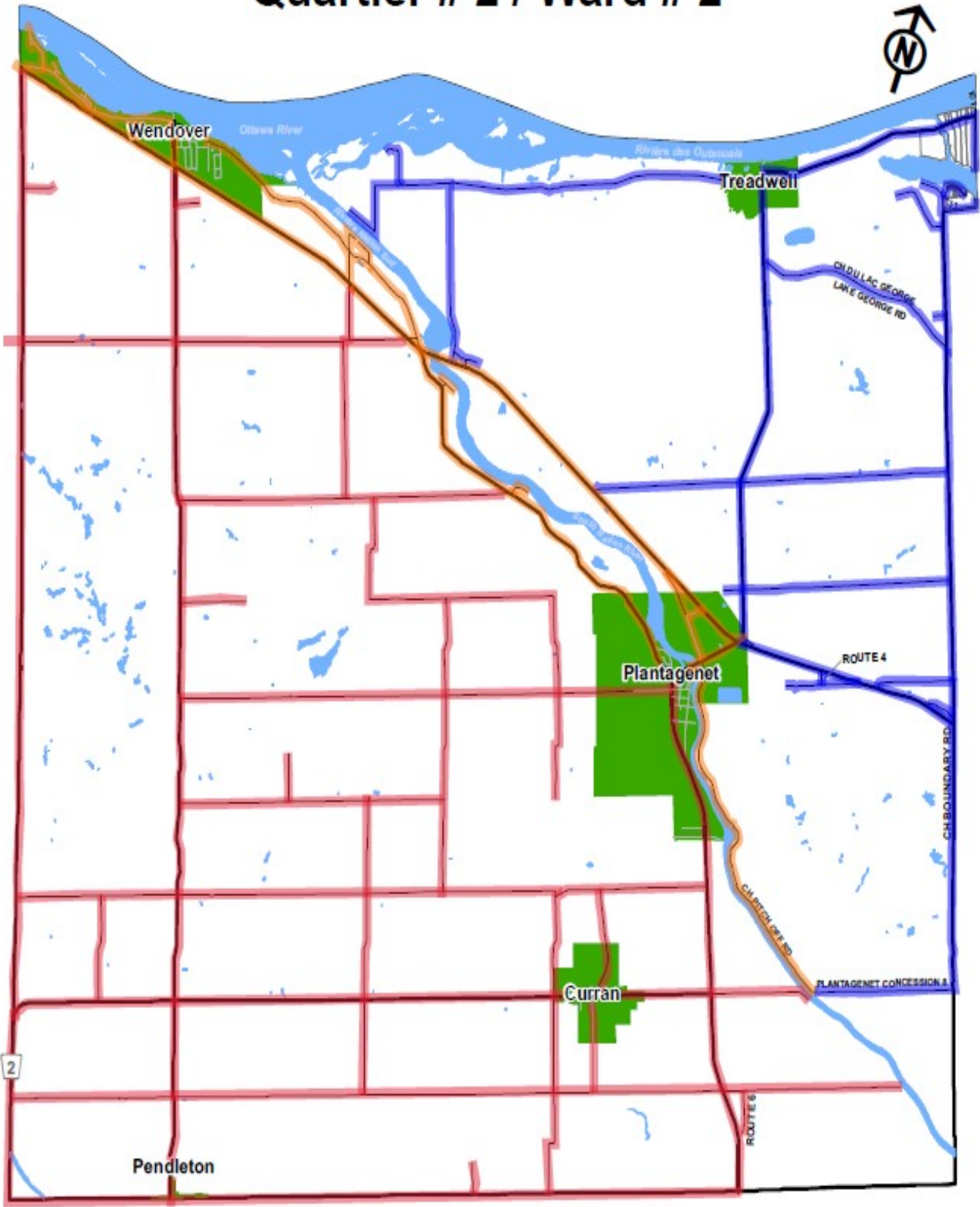
Explosive or highly combustible material of any nature; corrosive or toxic material; waste residue resulting from building, construction, alterations, or demolition operations; carcasses or parts thereof of animals; any liquid wastes; pathological wastes; any hazardous substances; waste of any nature and kind that is prohibited for disposal at the site by reason of the provisional Certificate of Approval; faeces of any cat (that are not normally accumulated in a litter box situated in a dwelling), dog, or fowl; grass clippings and leaves; biomedical waste; automobiles, vehicles or any part thereof; fences, fence posts, fence wire; propane, fuel or gas tanks; sawdust and/or shavings; hay, straw, and manure.

* Building, construction, alteration, or demolition waste may be brought directly to the landfill site subject to costs, as set in the municipal by-law.

User Fees

The fee for depositing residential waste at the landfill is 65 cents per cubic foot. The fee for the disposal of construction materials is \$1.30 per cubic foot.

RECYCLING

Recyclable materials can be placed in a blue bin, clear bag or any other container clearly marked with an “R” or the word “recycling”. Recycling collection is done at the same time as regular garbage collection. Plastic and paper can be put in the same container. If non-recyclable items are in your blue bin or another designated container, the waste collection crew will not pick them up.

All recycling goes to the Recycle-Action Sorting Centre.

Please note that cardboard boxes will need to be unpacked and folded into segments shorter than four (4) feet. If the boxes are not unpacked, they will not be picked up.

Styrofoam is not accepted in the blue box. If you have it in large quantities, you can deposit it at Recycle-Action in Hawkesbury.



RECYCLING OF ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS

* You can dispose of your electronic products in the container provided for this purpose at the Alfred landfill site.

Electronics: CD-ROM drives, computer disk drives, keyboards, mice, modems, terminals, micro and minicomputers, monitors, liquid crystal displays (LCD) or plasma, personal computers (desktop, laptop, notebook and notepad style), handhelds and printers [copiers, scanners and typewriters], fax machines telephones [mobile and smart], pagers, televisions (CRT technology), audio and video players, cameras, equalizers, preamplifiers and amplifiers, radios, receivers, speakers, tuners, turntables, video players/projectors and VCRs, kitchen appliances and Christmas lights.

CHRISTMAS TREES



In January of each year, you can dispose of your Christmas trees by bringing them to the back of the Plantagenet Municipal Garage, the back of the Lefavre Fire Hall, the Alfred Water Tower or the back of the Wendover Community Center.

SPRING GARBAGE COLLECTION

There is an annual Spring Garbage Collection intended for bulky items such as listed below. It is offered free to residents.

The following items are collected: furniture, refrigerators, stoves, dishwashers, washers, dryers, air conditioners, furnaces, bed frames, mattresses, barrels, hot water tanks, etc.



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

Prescott-Russell Recreational Trail

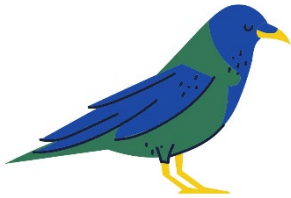

Alfred Bog Walk



A bog is a rare habitat for many species of animals and birds. The 10,000 hectares of Alfred Bog's unique ecosystem is now managed by Ontario Parks as a provincial nature reserve. The 0.273 km walkway at the Alfred Bog allows you to admire this beautiful ecosystem while ensuring its protection. During your visit, take the time to observe the various birds that nest there, or others that stop there during the spring and fall migration periods.

To access it, take Concession 11 south of Alfred and follow the signs to the bog.

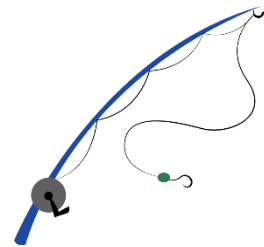
